COLLEGE SUNDAY JANUARY 7, 2018





Instructions are important and are usually a result of serious thought and preparation ó especially final instructions. A sports analyst recently reported that Nick Sabin (Alabama Crimson Tide coach) agonizes over his final instructions for the team prior to each game. One might wonder why that should be so important. Perhaps it is because this just might motivate them and impact their performance during the game.

Jesusø message and final instructions to His followers prior to His ascension are recorded in Matthew 28:18-20 and Acts 1:8. He told them: õI have been given complete authority in heaven and on earth. Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations; baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Teach those new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age.ö (Matthew 28:18-20 NLT) and õí when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, you will receive power and will tell people about me everywhere ó in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.ö (Acts 1:8 NLT)

Notice that these are *commands*, and not merely suggestions. They are intended to indicate the importance of not only sharing the message of salvation, but also teaching (discipling) new believers our Saviors instructions for righteous living and our responsibilities as His children. In His final words to His followers, Jesus is, in fact, actually commissioning them as missionaries and mentors (teachers.) He is sharing with them that *every believer is a missionary* and *every unbeliever is a mission field;* therefore, our responsibility as believers is tremendous and can only be accomplished through daily communication with Him and obeying His instructions.

As we approach the season of our emphasis upon the *America for Christ Offering*, please pray earnestly that the offering will honor our Savior, and seeking Godøs will for your life in the areas of personal involvement as well as financial support. In His Word, God promises blessings for those who are obedient to His leadership ó and GOD ALWAYS KEEPS HIS PROMISES!
