As we begin to head into the summer months, we hear many of church members talking about vacations, family reunions, outdoor events and cookouts. All of these events are wonderful settings that will open the door for relationship building if we think about those opportunities before we take part.

For example, one of the greatest things we can do at these events is to talk about our love of Jesus Christ with our friends and family. Having this omeaningfulo fellowship time at these events does not have to be preachy and intrusive, but what they can be is genuine and honest. What is meaningful fellowship, you may wonder, and how do we do it? It is actually not that complicated and is much easier than you think. The concept of meaningful fellowship is to use five-to-ten minutes and tell someone what you are up to, or doing in church, and always end that conversation by inviting them to join you at an upcoming service.

According to Christianity Today, nine out of ten people who are unchurched say they would attend a service if they were invited. Can you believe that fact? Nine out of ten unchurched people surveyed said they would attend a service if they were asked. We are missing opportunities at every corner.

In the coming months, yough hear me talk a lot about growing from the inside out. When you hear that, what I mean is that we need to start inviting some people we know to join us at First Baptist. It is fun to go to church with people you know. Imagine two or three people right now that you would love to have in church with you today if you could. Often, we fall prey to hoping people will just walk through our doors on Sunday. We need to be more intentional in our efforts. I have found that being intentional doesnot have to be "Bible-Pounding," it just needs to be done in love and sincerity. It is as simple as saying why you attend church.

One more nugget before I go this monthí In the same article I referenced, it points out that many of the unchurched felt guilty about not attending church. This is another reason that having a õrealö or õgenuineö conversation with someone you know is a great place to start.

We have a great church. First Baptist has plenty of seats for people to come join us and learn about the Lord. There is probably a seat by you that you can offer that special someone in your friend circle. We have great youth programs to encourage these persons to bring their children to youth fellowship for spiritual growth. The Bible is clear about our efforts being fruitful. In Isaiah 51:11, we learn the Lord's Word will not be void...It will achieve its purpose.

So, don't be afraid, and let us invite someone to church.







All blood types are needed.

If you have given before, please consider giving again.

If you have never given, please consider starting to give to this needy cause. The donation time from registration to recovery is about 1 hour.

- Registration includes going over eligibility, showing ID (such as driverø license), getting information about donating blood.
- Health History includes answering questions about your health history, where and when you have traveled, prescription medications, temperature, pulse, BP and hemoglobin check.
- Donation includes lying down to have your blood drawn
- Refreshments and Recovery allows for a snack and 10 to 15 minutes of recovery time before you leave.

Remember, the life you save, may be your own.




