Many in our congregation will be traveling over the next several weeks as we are in the midst of vacation season. My prayer is that God above extends traveling mercies to each of you as you spend time with family and friends over the summer months. Make the most out of those visits. You never know when this year could be your last with that special person, so make it count.

The month of July is special, not because it my birthday month, but because we celebrate the birthday of the United States of America in what we call Independence Day! As you know, our independence from Great Britain is recognized as July 4, 1776. In 1776, there were 2.5 million people living in the new nation and these people were no longer forced to accept a state religion. These people could now worship as they saw fit. Here we are 242 years and 316 million Americans later, and we still have that same right. *Unfortunately, today, not everyone worships our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.* Instead, they have placed their faith and trust in man and other gods. This should not be surprising, as it has always been that way, and we see that all throughout the Bible.

There was a time that Joshua had to take a stand for what he believed when others were on the fence, and seemingly drifting in their faith. The people in that day were unsure about who to worship, or even why they worship. Joshua was bold and assembled the people together and called them out for their worshiping of other gods. He told them to worship and serve the living God in sincerity (Joshua 24:14). He encouraged them to turn to the one true God by putting away the gods that their fathers worshiped back in Egypt and the gods of the Amorites. Joshua compelled them to choose who they wanted to serve. They were asked to take a stand. *Then, Joshua boldly commanded that he and his house would serve the Lord*.

Oh, that we would be so bold. Are we taking a stand? Many of the children today only see July 4 as merely a day set aside to watch fireworks, and maybe hang out at the pool. They see the pleasures of this world as their god. But what is our role? I believe we have the responsibility to make sure that our friends, our neighbors, our children, and our grandchildren understand just how blessed we are to live in the United States. Not only did our forefathers risk their lives, but many servicemen and servicewomen have defended this nation and still do today, to give us the privileges we are afforded in the Constitution.

Our nation was founded on Christian values. We know that God blesses those who honor him. In Deuteronomy 28:8, the Bible says, õí *The Lord God will bless you in the land He is giving you*.ö I like to think that statement can apply to us even today, because I believe with all might heart, He gave us this land so that He may be worshiped in Spirit and Truth. *This July 4, we celebrate our nation's independence which is always joyous, but I challenge you to remember the ultimate freedom we have today, which is found in the saving grace of Jesus Christ.*

Liberty is too precious a thing to be buried in books. It costs too much to be hoarded.


Make us see that our liberty is not the right to do as we please, but the opportunity to please to do what is right.








had the biggest offering, Leanne would get 3 pies in the face. But if the girls won, Pastor Toby would get pie-eyed. Guess who won!!!


Trees from Zechariah 3 for South Africa

The money contributed to this project will help train, equip and supply people to run local fruit and nut tree grafting nurseries for local profit, nutrition, environment improvement and sustainability in South Africa.

The project will be managed by American Baptist International Ministries Medical Missionaries Drs. Rick and Anita Gutierrez.
