As the fall season is upon us, I write this month's article sitting behind the desk in the Pastor's Office, which has been beautifully transformed into a tranquil and professional workspace that would be the envy of any pastor. Helen Johnson has truly outdone herself with her decorating skills in the office that is just marvelous. The office is complete with a couch and two chairs, that are not only comfortable, but gorgeous, surrounded with end tables and lamps. This seating area is a vital part of family ministry. This includes a place for counseling, funeral service and wedding planning, and of course, conversation in general. When I became your pastor, I felt a ministry seating area in the office was vital to meeting the needs of the congregation. When you stop by, you will certainly notice the desk which has been a part of the pastor's office at FBC for many years. It has been completely refinished and looks new. I also want to thank the Stephenson family for providing the large desk chair that is just the right size for a larger pastor like me.

Of course, the office has a couple of my family treasures as decorations that I wanted to share with you. One is a framed and matted Bible leaflet on the wall behind the couch. It is a page out of a 1560 authentic Geneva Bible. The Geneva Bible was the first Bible printed to have chapters and verses. You can read the story of Lazarus the way it read in the 1500s. If you look at the bookcase, you'll see some of my Billy Graham collection from his crusades and with an autographed photograph. Dr. Graham is an example to me about how one can serve the Lord with integrity and be a beacon of hope to people who need Jesus.

During my first month as pastor, I have introduced the *FBC15* plan. I will probably mention it over the next several weeks. *This effort showcases 15 areas of ministry in our church where you are needed, as we prepare for church growth.* You can do something easy as committing to pray for me and the church daily, or attend our evening services, or volunteer with the children's program, help in the flower garden, agree to greet new people in the church and introduce yourself, and even sing in the choir. There are 15 areas, where you can get involved. If you haven't found your place yet, please continue to pray where you fit it. From age 8 to 108, there are things you can do at FBC to help our ministry grow, not just in number but in understanding of the Lord. I have always believed that God will never send us more people than we can handle, and that's a good thing. We are on the right track, and you have responded well so far, but we need to keep on keeping on. God's Word in Galatians 6:9 says, "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we don't give up."

With your help and support, we have rejuvenated our Bible Study on Wednesday nights to include prayer, testimonies, music and interactive-upbeat studying of God's Word in a semi-formal setting. We have had over 50 people in the church take part in at least one study. Over 20 persons have had perfect attendance heading into week four. Those who have missed for the most part, have only missed one or two nights. Studying the Bible is fun. Proverbs 16:20 reminds us to heed God's instructions and to be blessed, we just need to trust God. My plan is to keep these Bible Studies upbeat and engaging. We have to really dig into the Word and see how it applies to our life. If you have not had the chance to get out to the Bible Study, then let me extend this invitation to you. As one person told me after the second night, folks don't know what they are missing. This is a part of our FBC15 outreach.

We are all very excited to see where the Lord is leading the church. Now is the time to invite someone to church. Let them be on the front end of this excitement, and understand that if you are enjoying church right now, so will they. Going to church is something we should want to do. Not out of any obligation, but because of the desire to worship God and to be with God's people. In the meantime, if I can be of help to you, pray with you, spend time with you in personal conversation, or if you just need a friend or a visit, please let me know. That's what I am here to do. This is an important part of pastoral ministry. My prayer is that you are blessed today, even more so than you were yesterday. I believe we are off to a great start at FBC.

We are seeing the same excitement occurring for Sunday night service. For the first time since I have been at FBC, the number of adults have outnumbered the youth on BOTH Wednesday and Sunday nights. This is incredible. That is a testament to your willingness to reengage the Lord in your way. It's a personal revival of sorts. Preparing sermons take hours of time and you being here shows me your love and support and more importantly, your willingness to grow deeper in God's Word. We do not repeat a Sunday morning sermon that night, instead, we share a new message coupled with prayer and testimonies. God's Word is alive and life-changing. We want to be able to meet people where they are, and for some, Sunday nights work better. For the rest of us, we just need a double-dose of Jesus' Word on Sunday to help get us through the week.

Let me close by thanking the Deacons and Trustees for your help with us moving into the parsonage. We are still living out of boxes, but we are getting closer, at least with the downstairs. Putting away 12 years of things from our last home, and going through numerous items that we have collected over the last 20 years, takes time. But it has been fun sifting through some memories and dusting off some old photographs, and so forth. Soon, we will be finished, and our home will be open to you. Just this past week, Jennifer and I have begun to visit some of our shut-ins. We look forward to being a part of your extended family, too. If we can be a part of your special gathering, an event, or something special in your lives, please let us know.

Pastors also write and deliver weekly sermons, and also host special guests and events. In short, pastors serve as the face and voice of the churches they represent.




