February is known as the love month. February is also the anniversary of mine and Jen's first date. I'll save you the details of that, but will say there is no greater feeling than love. To give love and to be loved are two of the most satisfying emotions we extend to one another. Of course, our love for each other in the church is brotherly love. We care for each other. We laugh with each other and we cry with each other. This is what makes a church family so special.

Jesus, Himself, told His followers that we have a new commandment to love each other. He said, that people will know from this behavior "love" that we are His disciples (John 13:34-35). Love is about putting someone else's needs above our own. The old adage is; love means never having to say you're sorry. Love is when someone needs you, and you're there, regardless. Love is taking that phone call at midnight when you're tired, because you know that someone needs your ear for that moment. Love is helping a person with groceries, medicine, a bill, babysitting for a child, helping clean the house, or mowing someone's lawn. Love is when you visit someone with the sole purpose of "visiting" to bring them joy. Love is when you remember anniversaries and dates of events in peoples' lives that matter most to them. This could be the birth of a child, a wedding, a baptism, or even a death in the family. Church, we are called to love, love, love. Galatians 5:13 reminds us to serve in love:

# *"For you, brethren, have been called to liberty; only do not use liberty as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another."*

Let us love freely and often. Let us find joy in extending a hand to those who need it. Let us find joy in encouraging others, praying with others, and helping where we can. Let us find joy in our giving. All of these things – are examples of love. Of course, the greatest example we have, is how Jesus gave His life for our sins. He took our punishment on the cross. He gave us eternal life, so we would not be separated from God.

## 2 Corinthians 5:21: "For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him."

I love the scriptures -- *"I go to prepare a place..,"* and *"I'll come again"* showing we're not forgotten. We are never really alone. Jesus is there. The Holy Spirit will comfort us and go with us. The Lord has an open ear toward us, because He loves us. And, we love Him.

John 14:3 "And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also." During this month, I challenge you to think about what you can do to show someone love. Don't wait until Valentine's Day either. That's too easy. But rather, find a way, where you can say to a friend, a brother or sister in Christ, a neighbor, or even a complete stranger...how much God loves them. Do it with a prayer together, a card, a gift, candy, or even just a brief conversation and a hug. We all love to be appreciated. So, who can we appreciate?

Letting people know how much they mean to us, is an example of God reaching out to us, when we least expected it. Be a blessing today. Let your LOVE shine... Perhaps, you can try a random act of kindness for no reason. Simply strive to demonstrate that God's love exists everywhere you go. February is a good reminder to us all, that **WE ARE LOVED**. *God is love*. Let's share that love with someone today!

# IT IS SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION TIME! HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR GIRLS & COLLEGE STUDENTS

### APPLICANT REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must:

a. Be a member of a West Virginia Baptist Convention Church for at least one year prior to her application;

b. Be an active participant in her church program;

c. Be a high school graduate;

 d. Submit a transcript of her grades from the last school attended in order to demonstrate scholastic ability and deportment;

e. Apply directly to the Coordinator of Scholarship/Loan;

 f. Demonstrate her financial need by completing the confidential questions on the application form;

g. Secure the endorsement of the pastor of her church for character and worthiness, which said endorsement must be received by the Coordinator of Scholarship/Loan no later than March 1st.

h. Submit a letter/essay on a personal reflection of her life;

i. Secure character references from two citizens of the community other than relations, which said references must be received by the Coordinator of Scholarship/Loan no later than March 1st .

As we live each day, we are making memories. Every day adds to them and determines more fully their final character. What we leave behind may not be intentional. We may change someone's life without even knowing it. But whether we know it or not, we pray that the impact we make on others is Christ-centered and Christ-pleasing.

My wife is constantly making memories and the way she does determines the way in which we live. Her memories will make our old age happy. That is what memories do! Our fondest memories should be our daily life in our Christian home. Memories should be made every day of the week, for you never know when you are making the last of them. Life is so uncertain that we never know when we are having the last meal, last talk or the last walk together. "Sin may sweep over the soul like a devastating fire; sorrow may quench every joy and hope; but the memory of a sweet and blessed home lives on like a solitary star burning in the night. And even in the midst of sin, its picture floats before the mind like a vanishing dream."

A memory that has been burnt into my soul by my wife is her nightly ritual with our son. A Legacy I know he'll carry in his heart for eternally. Every night as my son goes to bed, with a gentle footstep she will enter his room and appear at his bedside. At first there are a few pleasant inquires of affection, which gradually deepened into words of counsel. Then she kneels' her head close to his, where her most earnest hopes and prayers will flow forth in prayer. How impressive a mother would wish for her boy! Rising with a goodnight kiss, she says I love you and departs.

A memory like this is the greatest gift a parent can leave a child. We must have Christ in our homes if our memories are to be all that they should.

May God help us all to live in a home so sweetly. One of the best rewards will be our children, grandchildren and future generations if they follow the example of my wife for building a Christian home where Jesus Christ is the continuously invited guest and His Word is our standard and guide. It builds a solid foundation against the time.
