Wow, can you believe the month of April is here. Easter is just around the corner. As we enter this holy month, we continue to think about God's amazing grace. The Lord sent us His one and only Son, that whosoever would believe on Him, would have everlasting life. There is a song about God's grace, called *Amazing Grace* that you probably know by heart. John Newton wrote the song about his life. Newton was a former slave trader who had served in the British Navy. Newton's life was steeped in misery as his mother died before his seventh birthday and he turned to alcohol and joined the Navy.

On one of his voyages, the ship he was in was caught in a very bad storm off the coast of Ireland and nearly sank. It was during this time that Newton prayed to God for help, and the ship seemingly lurched to one side, moving cargo to the side of the ship, that somehow filled the hold in the ship's hull. Newton who saw this as the hand of God, converted to Christianity. Sometime after his conversion, he became an abolitionist, as someone against slavery. Later in life, following a stroke, Newton would reflect on God's amazing grace in his life, noting that he was once blind, but now he sees, and penned the words to the song we sing today called "Amazing Grace." Newton saw the hand of God upon him and his life, and the world as a whole. He experienced God's amazing grace and was changed.

As we head into this holy time of the year, let us remember God's amazing grace that He has given to each and every one of us who believe. It is His grace that saved us from our sins. It is His love that reached through the mire of sin, to find us. It was His death and resurrection that gave us life everlasting. If we really think about God's love for us, we will want others to experience what we have in our lives. Don't give up. Hold true to the Word of God. He is faithful. He is just. He is ever-present for our calling upon Him.

May we use this month to rekindle our love for each other and for our Lord. Let us look to reach the poor in spirit, the downcast, and the forgotten. Jesus would want us to do that. Let us reflect on God's love for us individually. Let's represent God's amazing grace faithfully, knowing that we are proof of His saving a bunch of sinners....in what we call First Baptist Church. 

- 1. Easter always occurs between March 22 and April 25.
- Easter is a 'moveable feast" one that is set according to the phases of the moon.
- In the 13th Century, the Church prohibited eating eggs during Holy Week. Marking the eggs laid during that week began the custom of decorating eggs.
- 4. Roast lamb, the main dish for Jewish Passover, is the traditional meat for Easter.
- 5. It is believed that an Italian baker made the pretzel to look like arms crossed during Passover season sometime between the 300s and 600s
- Giving eggs is a symbol of 'rebirth' in many cultures.
- Passover was the Jewish feast celebrated the week Jesus was crucified.
- 8. Malchus the the high priest servant who's ear was cut off by a disciple and reattached by Jesus.
- When Jesus died, there were 3 hours of darkness in the land.



2019 Mission Outreach Project Rice for Students in Thailand GOAL: \$6,000

In the overcrowded city of Chiang Mai, Thailand, it is hard to come by steady employment, much less a living wage. Parents struggle to meet their family's basic needs, and when there isn't enough food to go around, the children are often sent out to the night market to beg. When children spend the night begging, they come to school exhausted, and both their health and classwork suffer





The House of Blessing is an early childhood education center that serves ethnic minority hill tribe children. It provides bags of rice to the students' families. Each family is required to contractually agree that the children will not be made to beg on school nights. As a result, children are coming to school more consistently, well rested, and better able to learn.

How We Can Help

\$30 provides one family with enough rice for a month. \$360 provides one family with enough rice for one year.

Our goal of \$6,000 would provide 16 families with enough rice for one year!

The Revolving Revival Is Back!




Once again, First Baptist Church will be joining with other churches in the Good Hope Association for our annual *Revolving Revival*.
