Be careful, Father, where your footsteps fall, For your son will keep in stride. Walk only in a pathway straight and true, So he can follow you with pride.



VALLEY FORGE, PA (ABNS 3/19/19)—In response to floods in the Plains and Midwest caused by rapid snowmelt and heavy rains, American Baptist Home Mission Societies, on behalf of American Baptist Churches USA, has launched a One Great Hour of Sharing campaign to raise much-needed funds for victims.

At least two people have been killed and several others are missing, prompting government leaders in Nebraska, Iowa, South Dakota, Wisconsin, Minnesota and Illinois to declare states of emergency, forcing residents of those states to flee their homes. News of the deaths came as Iowa residents were driven from their homes when the Missouri River breached and broke levees. In the southwest portion of the state, the river rose to over 30 feet.

Rev. Dr. Robin Stoops, executive minister, ABC of Nebraska, reports two-thirds of the population in his state has been affected by the flooding. The ABC Church in Valley (United Faith Community Church) has sustained damage from sewage water coming up through basement toilets. Currently there is about two feet of sewage water in the basement classrooms. Gibbon Baptist Church is assisting its members and members of the community with clean up and repair. First Baptist Church of Fremont is working with the poorest elementary school in the area, providing backpacks of food and other supplies to students; many live in a trailer park that has been completely flooded. "The list goes on and on," Stoop says.

"Please pray for survivors, many of whom fled their homes with little more than the clothes on their backs," says Dr. Jeffrey Haggray, ABHMS executive director. "And consider prayerful giving: your financial gifts will allow survivors to return to their lives with some sense of normalcy."



2019 Mission Outreach Project Rice for Students in Thailand GOAL: \$6,000

In the overcrowded city of Chiang Mai, Thailand, it is hard to come by steady employment, much less a living wage. Parents struggle to meet their family's basic needs, and when there isn't enough food to go around, the children are often sent out to the night market to beg. When children spend the night begging, they come to school exhausted, and both their health and classwork suffer.





The House of Blessing is an early childhood education center that serves ethnic minority hill tribe children. It provides bags of rice to the students' families. Each family is required to contractually agree that the children will not be made to beg on school nights. As a result, children are coming to school more consistently, well rested, and better able to learn.

How We Can Help

\$30 provides one family with enough rice for a month. \$360 provides one family with enough rice for one year. Our goal of \$6,000 would provide 16 families with enough rice for one year!

I'd like thank you each of you who have already supported CeCe's Friends! My sister, Mindy, and I have been amazed and humbled by the support and encouragement given to our little project by the American Baptist Women of Ravenswood.

Please allow me to tell you a bit about CeCe's Friends and how it came to be. Our mother, Charlotte L. Mitchell passed away on May 17, 2017 from Alzheimer's. The disease was brutal, unforgiving and horrible to watch. It took everything away from our mother, except for her maternal instinct. She did not know her husband, children, or grandchildren but she knew she was a mother. Looking back on that time, we all wish we'd thought of giving her a doll much earlier, for it became the only peace she had during a very scary time. When my sister brought one of her daughter's baby dolls into Mom's hospital room, Mom reached out for her immediately. The nurse at her bedside asked her what her baby's name was and my Mom replied "her name is CeCe and she's ready for a nap". With that, she tucked her in right beside of her and CeCe continued to offer Mom comfort until the very end. CeCe was beside her in her Hospice room and she was cremated with her after Mom's beautiful soul met Jesus.


Our mother was the kindest, most loving person you'd ever have the pleasure of knowing. She was a blessing to all her knew her. She believed in God's grace and was the embodiment of the Fruits of the Spirit. My sister and I wanted to honor her life in some way, long after she was no longer with us. She left very big shoes to fill!!

It is our goal that every Memory Care facility in Kanawha and Jackson counties will eventually have CeCe's Friends available to anyone who needs to be reminded of her maternal instinct, and we give the men their choice of a doll, a stuffed dog or a gift bag made especially for them.
