As we enter the month of September, we start to think about the season of Fall and of course Labor Day. While the Labor Day holiday affords most of us a day off work to rest, which is important, it also reminds me that there is work to do and how we should do it. Biblically speaking, we can use the Labor Day holiday to remind us of what God's Word says about laboring and resting.

One example is found in Colossians 2:23, where Paul writes, "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters." As Christians, we should strive to do the best we can, at whatever we do, or wherever we work. If we work in an office, we should be the best clerk. If we work in a school, we should strive to be the best teacher the child has ever known, and so forth. When people watch how we live and how we work, do they see Christ in us? Do they see laziness? Do they see character? Do they see zeal? Passion? Dedication? I have always hoped those who watch me, see someone who works hard, is honest, and does as he promises or says. I'd like to think I take responsibility. We all should.

Another scripture is found in Psalm 127 reads "Unless the Lord builds the house, the builders labor in vain. Unless the Lord watches over the city, the guards stand watch in vain..." These scriptures tell us that if God is not a part of our efforts, it really won't last. True service and work that is founded and honored in Christ, perseveres or endures. Why? Because our efforts honor Him. God is faithful! We have to give all of the honor for what we are able to do, and any success we have to Him. Proverbs 16:3 says "Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and he will establish your plans." The effort will be blessed. This is yet another reminder that our success and the fruit of our labor is found only in Christ Jesus. We should take no glory or honor for our talents or abilities, but instead, give credit and praise to God for equipping us to the do the work that needs done. In this case, God has provided for our families by giving us the ability and desire to do what we do, or have done, to support them over the years. With the Lord's help, I have a home, food, car, etc.

In closing, while most of the article focused on work, we need to pause to mention rest. We will work ourselves to death if we are not careful. I think I read somewhere that there is not a tombstone known in the U.S. that reads, "I should have worked more." While God doesn't need to rest, He did so, after creation was completed. It was a time to honor His work. "On the seventh day, He rested from all His work," it says in Genesis 2:1-3. We need to take time to rest from your labors. Rest allows the stress of life to subside. Rest allows us to worry less. Rest restores our minds to refocus on what needs done. Rest helps eliminate error. Rest allows us to be revived. Remember, when we have rested, we are able to move forward toward another day, working harder than the day before, and so forth. So this Labor Day, if you have the day off, relax. When we relax, let us meditate on Jesus and He will give us rest. His burden is light. Happy Labor Day! Now, let's get some rest because we got a lot of work to do for Jesus.

Fall is also a great time to start learning in Sunday School. Proverbs has many verses on knowledge and wisdom. Some are:


- 1:5 Let the wise hear and increase in learning, and the one who understands obtain guidance.

## **Changing Seasons**

#### Ecclesiastes 3:1-8

One of the things I missed while in Asia was Autumn. I grew up in West Virginia and the state has some truly phenomenal Fall seasons. I even love the bareness of the trees as winter begins because I understand that the process is necessary for the new, vibrant season of spring. It was difficult to describe to people in the areas where trees only loose their leaves as new foliage is coming on.

I have come to the decision that my season has been, and still is, changing.

I will be retiring from International Ministries on October 31, 2019. I felt that I needed to change my focus two years ago when I returned from the Philippines. I was excited to explore the new responsibilities of working with IM while living among my family in WV and visiting several times a year with our partners in Asia. But now I realize that my season as a missionary overseas is coming to an end. In other words, just like the trees, I need to make a break and strengthen my work with ministry here in the US.

I have some deputation commitments before the end of October, but my focus will soon be on my home church, Philippi Baptist, and specific local and international ministries that I support as an individual.



I have been blessed with an amazing Missions Partnership Team, including Rev. Dick Hepler, Convener, Rev. Dana Gatewood, Mrs. Sandy Phares, Mrs. Jeanie Philipps, Rev. Jim Stinespring, and, as Volunteer Assistant, Mrs. Susan Stinespring. I have had small churches faithfully support me with \$25 per month, and large ones with several

hundred per month. There have been several churches that have spent time stuffing envelopes, and hundreds of people that have prayed for me, and I have been blessed. I chose this time to retire so that these churches and individuals might seamlessly make support changes in their upcoming budgets. (However, I will still need support for September and October, please.)

There are at least four ways to choose a Missionary to support. I encourage you to continue your commitment to missions by choosing a Missionary in the next few weeks.

1. Your local Region. I am from the WVBC and we are blessed to have 3 missionary families on the field at this time—

The Aragons- Juan, Denise, Juancito and Ziba The Myers-Keith, Debbie, Boyden and Baillie The Reeds-J.D., Rhonda, Grace, Abie and Nathan

Each of these families would welcome new or increased support.

- 2. By Country. You may want to learn about a particular country and the ministry there. Choose a missionary from the country.
- 3. By Ministry. Another way is to pick a ministry, ie. Education, agriculture, Human Trafficking, and support a mission unit in that ministry.
- New Kid on the Block. Choose to support a new missionary, someone who is raising funds to do ministry. Watch and participate in the process they must go through.

It has been a privilege and honor to work with our local Baptist churches, our international partners, and with you for the last 20 years. Your faithfulness has been never-ending and your prayers continual. You have shown me mercy, understanding, and forgiveness for my many short-comings and faults. You have been examples for the "Hands and Heart" of Christ in so many ways, and I will always be grateful for you.

Philippians 1:3-6 "I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus."

#### Past Experience

I recently received a request at the church asking for information on baptism or membership of someone looking for her great, great grandfather. I went to the library and began to peruse some older church books that contained minutes of meetings and other information to see if the name "Jones" was included for any reason.

The time spent was interesting in more ways than one might think. One book from the women's group Home Workers was from the 1920s. The writing, with what was obviously **not** done with a Bic pen, was in proper cursive - something not seen much anymore...maybe in Amy Starkey's beautifully scripted Christmas cards...but not much else. The content told of the women doing many tasks too...something that continues today but in different ways.

I thought some of you may find it interesting to see just what was said and done in one of their meetings so I am transposing one of them for you to read. I hope you enjoy it as much as I have.

Sept. - 1924.

The Sept. meeting of the Home Workers was entertained by Mrs. John Noll at her home. There was but little work but a pleasant afternoon was spent. 23 members and some visitors were present. Minutes of the August meeting were approved. Mrs. Nichols was elected to membership. A note from Rev. J. E. Hutchison was read which expressed his appreciation of the Home Workers gift to him.

It was decided that the H. W. would co-operate with the women's S.S. class in a bake sale for the benefit of the Pt Pleasant Church.

Receipts of the afternoon \$4.05

Other entries contain interesting information of how the ladies of the church sewed rags, quilted, and made baby clothes for the needy. They also helped paint the parsonage and raised funds to pay off the bathroom. Our ladies of heritage were busy in the church, community and very mission minded.

The same experience continues today as our women strive to be servants of the Lord. Our women are busy reaching out to the needy, caring for those who are sick and spreading the love of God around us.

95 years later, our CIRCLE meeting for the month of September 2019 will be at the home of Debby Bashaw on September 19 at 7:00. I hope all women of the church will come out for a great time of fellowship. We just may be continuing a legacy.

On September 8 immediately following the morning worship service, CIRCLE members will be offering their favorite rice recipe dishes for those who would like to try some.






