As we gaze at the names on the luminaries, we enter the Sanctuary one more time before Christmas Day. The Christmas Eve cantata itself is magical. Then in the midst of a darkness, the final Advent candle is lit. It's the candle representing Jesus. It's from this candle, those in attendance will quietly and reverently light their candle. It's in this stillness, the flame from the Lord's candle is gently passed person-to-person, and family-by-family, until the congregation glows in radiant light. The congregation sings Silent Night. It was a magical night just over 2,000 years ago that changed the world forever. It changed my life. I know it changed yours. Church, let us join together and prepare our hearts for what is the greatest time of the year. It's not because of the presents we might receive, but because of the Gift that has already been given.

Focus on Sunday School:

The Best Gift of All

Years ago, when I was in the fourth grade at Washington Elementary in Gallipolis, I was in the school Christmas play. I was in a group called *The Readers*. Actually, we didn't read anything - we memorized our lines and said them together. The words left a profound impact on me and I remember them to this day - 60 years later. I love to recite them all though the year: as I drive around, as I sit at my desk, anytime Christmas is mentioned. The words are powerful, sweet, amazing, gentle, exciting and kind. They tell of a **Gift** so miraculous that it made my young heart happy and still does.

Here is what I memorized:

And it came to pass in those days, that there went out a decree from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be taxed. And this taxing was first made when Cyrenius was governor of Syria. And all went to be taxed, every one into his own city.

And Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judaea, unto the city of David, which is called Bethlehem; because he was of the house and lineage of David: to be taxed with Mary his espoused wife, being great with child.

And so it was that, while they were there, the days were accomplished that she should be delivered. And she brought forth her firstborn son, and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger; because there was no room for them in the inn.

And there were in the same country, shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them: and they were sore afraid.

And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, which is Christ the Lord. And this shall be a sign unto you; Ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger.

And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God, and saying, Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men!

Times have changed - no longer do children memorize biblical passages for any reason at public schools. To do so, would make a cause for the Supreme Court. But long ago, in a far away town of Gallipolis, a young girl heard the words and kept them in her heart.


