



As we head into the month of October, I am reminded about the importance of discipleship. This is a fancy word that centers around learning from someone. The Vine's Expository Dictionary of New Testament Words asserts the word "disciple" in the Greek is *manthano* which means "to learn," or "one who follows one's teaching." Think of the game, Follow the Leader. The leader in this old schoolyard game would lead a single file line of people making movements and gestures that had to be followed. Everything the leader did, the follower had to do. If the leader raised his right arm, then everyone following would raise his right arm. Simply put, there was no discussion about why, it was understood that as a follower, you did as the leader did. In that game, if you chose to do your own thing or go your own way, then you were not doing as you should as a follower.

Likewise, our life as a Christian is a lot like that game on the bigger scale. We have Jesus Christ in our lives who is our Leader. He walks with us through the journey we call life. As a disciple, or learner of His teaching, we follow Him and do what His teaching says. He is more than a leader in the life of a Christian, He is our Shepherd, our Father, and our Friend. *He leads us besides the still waters* (Psalm 23). He protects us. We follow Him not because we are in a game, but because *He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life* (John 14:6). He knows the way we should go, which ultimately ends in eternity with Him. He wants us to endure and persevere. When you and I commit to being a disciple of Christ, we not only learn His Word, but we also apply His Word to our life. When we learn, and then do what we learn, we signify we are disciples of Christ. By being a disciple of Christ, we try to live like Jesus wants us to. He knows our voice. He knows our name. *Why would we not want to follow Him?* As we enter October, let us pause a moment to thank God for teaching us how to live. He gave us His Word, so that we could live. It is not burdensome to follow. **It is joy**. Can we esteem to be a better disciple of the Lord's? Because in Discipleship, we put our learning into action and we love the brethren.

Beginning October 1, the Sunday morning worship services on Sunday will be moving back into the sanctuary until further notice. *Our start time will go back to the original 10:45 a.m.* in preparation for resuming Sunday School sometime in the near future at 9:30. The health department has informed us the indoor mask requirement has to remain in place for indoor worship at this time. When there is a change in these requirements, we will let you know. Our service will continued to be streamed online for those who prefer to watch the broadcast from home.

Last month, I was extremely happy Susan West, with the church's Family Life program, held two movie nights in the courtyard on the inflatable big screen. There were about 25 people onhand who were seated with their families under a clear sky. Normally, movies are held inside. It was great to see people come together for fun. She is also planning a family pumpkin carving event outside in the courtyard that ends with everyone's pumpkin lit up. This was a huge success last year. I'm sure it will be great this year. Talia Martinez, with the church's Children's Department, is also planning some great activities for this month including a *Trunk or Treat* in our parking lot for our kids, just in case the city's trick or treat night is canceled. Additionally, I want to thank Jo Hendricks for stepping forward to lead a new Young Adult Group for ages 18-35. The Board of Christian Education approved this class back in March, and it is now up and running. It is a Sunday School class of sorts, as far as Bible Study, that will address life issues. They may meet on days other than Sunday, depending on their schedules. They will also be incorporating some activities to grow in fellowship. This age group has fallen through the cracks at our church and others for many years. Having attended the first meeting held at the Riverfront Park last month, it was refreshing to see their excitement about the class. In all, there were about ten present for that first meeting. If you know someone in this age range, get them involved in this group, even if they are not affiliated with our church. In 20 years, these folks will be the leaders in our church and we should do everything in our power to help them grow and excel in their faith and to be ready to take those reigns. *God is moving!*

Lastly, thank all of you for your continued giving during the pandemic. First Baptist has been blessed. Thank you for remaining faithful in your giving which has helped the church continue to meet its obligations. FINANCE COMMITTEE- 2021 Budget

The Finance Committee has completed the process of Budget development and has submitted the final draft to the church for review. We will discuss and vote on this proposal at the October 14 business meeting. It is posted at the church and available through e-mail or a written copy from Susan.

This year, we recommended that each group or persons requesting budgetary monies submit a proposal of plans and an amount requested. Special thanks to those who took the time to complete this as it was very valuable to the committee as they reviewed and made decisions. This year, we were able to meet the requests submitted. In addition, the committee met a total of 3 times to review and revise the budget. Much thought and work went into developing a plan that will meet the needs of the church while planning ahead for future needs.

Overall, there was a 2.9 % increase in the 2021 budget (\$182,265.08) from 2020 (\$176,905.08) but there were also 6 new categories of expenditures added. They were: Pastor Discretionary, Deacon Discretionary, Young Adults, Programs & Activities, Awards & Recognition and Local Missions.

GIVING THROUGH TITHELY

Covid-19 has certainly had an impact on programs and services. A silver lining in the midst of this pandemic is that we have seen an increase in giving using Tithely. Between the months of January to Sept 9, 2020 the total gifts on Tithely were \$44,202.93 (up from \$22,177.30 during the same time period in 2019). Also, the number of donors has almost tripled (from 32 in 2019 to 95 this year). Since our services and bible studies are on-line, many from outside the area are able to participate and many contribute using the Tithely app. The previous finance groups who had the foresight to add this to FBC so that we were already set up to weather the Covid crisis are to be commended.

Also, we have added several other categories of giving but the most common contributions are to the General Fund, Deacon Fund, Building Fund, and Various Missions. Check it out to see if this is something you might like to participate in as well.

LEGACY GIVING

In the past few months, our church has been blessed to have received monetary gifts in the amount of \$10,000 from the Anne Adkins Family and \$30,000 from an Anonymous Donor. As a result, we have been able to purchase the 2 new much needed furnace units at a cost of \$14,383.99 which were installed in mid September. These generous donations have prompted the Finance Committee to work on a Legacy Giving program for others who might like to provide for church needs as well. Donors—you are setting a wonderful legacy for others to follow. THANK YOU SO MUCH for planting these seeds! May the harvest be plentiful!
