Christmas should be a good time for families, but it is often a stressful time because of the fear and pressure of the having the perfect Christmas to meet everyone's expectation. We can reduce that stress if we keep Christmas in perspective. Harlan Miller said, "Probably the reason we all go so hay-wire at Christmas time with the endless unrestrained, and often, silly buying of gifts is that we don't quite know how to put our love into words." The one thing the pandemic cannot change, is the reason why we celebrate Christmas -- Jesus.

This season, I encourage you to call someone who needs to hear that you love them. You can extend forgiveness to someone who needs it. Send someone a card to show who needs to know they are not forgotten. Be grateful and thankful that God loved you so much, He has already given you the gift of all gifts, when He gave you Jesus. May we all be healthy and prosperous this Christmas season and, may be, honor the Lord Jesus with our lives this Christmas season.

The great thing about this play? You can watch it over and over again! It will also be on the church Facebook.




## *Youth Live Nativity*

Talia made 25 boxes and delivered them to our kids with an Advent Calendar, games, candy and goodies to help them learn about Advent.



## Focus on Sunday School:



During the month of December, we all turn our thoughts to the coming of the Christ Child. Our hearts are filled with wonder at the sights and sounds around us. Our children are excited for that coming night when Santa Claus will enter our homes and deposit wished-for gifts under a tree sparkling with lights.

Others, however, may look and see tawdry signs of commercialism. But let's look again. We may see signs that allow us a chance to witness for Jesus.

*Angels abound throughout Christmas.* The angels heralded the birth of our Savior. That tree topper on your Christmas tree is a symbol of the angel that visited Mary, the one that visited Joseph to say you will have a son and call His name Jesus.

*A favorite song of children at Christmas is Jingle Bells.* Shepherds would use bells so that lost sheep would be able to find their way home. We pray for the lost that each soul will be able to turn to Jesus and enter heaven.

*The Christmas trees and wreaths are made of evergreen trees.* They symbolize the everlasting love of our Father in heaven that so loved the world, He gave His only begotten Son to us who believe.

*The shining Christmas Star that also is at the top of some trees* is a remembrance of the Star above Bethlehem that led the Magi to the Christ Child.

*The gifts we give* represent those gifts that were given to the Jesus at His birth.

*The candles that we light during Advent,* allow us to reflect that Jesus is the light of the world. He came to defeat sin and bring us to the heavenly light of the Lord.

*The Candy Cane is a familiar sight.* It symbolizes the Shepherd's crook that gently guides sheep to safety. The white stripe is the purity of Jesus who lived without sin, but took on our sin when He was on the cross and shed His blood, which is shown by the red on the candy cane.

*The multicolored lights on the tree* remind me of a rainbow that shows the everlasting covenant between our heavenly Father and the earth.

All around us, we see the sights and hear the sounds of Christmas. I pray that everyone will take a moment to remember what this season is about. I also pray that we will take the time to be like the angels on that holy night and proclaim to the lost, ***“Unto you is born this day a Savior, which is Christ the Lord.”*** May your Christmas be blest.
