Special thanks goes out to Talia Martinez and her Advent Countdown Videos for the kids, as well as to Susan West who spearheaded, wrote, and produced our Christmas Eve program. These efforts were magnificent. Our luminaria the church sponsored were beautiful even while we spent a couple of hours battling heavy winds. As your pastor, I can never thank you enough for all that you did. The decorations by the Jon Moore family were stunning as always and we've received tons of feedback on our broadcasts for how beautiful the church was during Christmas. In closing, I want to thank the Deacons, Jo Hendricks, Monique Nunley (who etched the pie and made the ornaments), and the young adult group and the many volunteers who helped deliver over 100 pies and ornaments to our church families as a special Christmas gift from the church. A lot of folks were surprised by the generosity and thoughtfulness of the church. It was a small token of love to tell people we have missed being with them in person at the sanctuary.

To be honest, I have been so proud of our church family and church leadership over the past nine months. Living and working during a worldwide pandemic and being in uncharted waters caused a lot of uneasiness and frustration, aggravation, and even some dissention in all of us. Yes, mask frustration was the gasoline on the fire, but isolation and separation fueled more concerns as families worried about their loved one's health and how to best keep them safe. These emotions have made church leadership tough, especially when we all have different opinions, and knowing that so many families in our church have lost loved ones to COVID-19. I can tell you that the deacons supporting the streaming effort at the church has been the single biggest accomplishment last year. Funds were quickly pulled together to purchase basic equipment needed for live streaming of the service which allowed the church to not miss one service in 2020 as a result of COVID-19. Having our church located in the city of Ravenswood where Internet was readily available and accessible, afforded the church the ability to use both Facebook Live and Zoom audio where many other churches did not have that outreach capability. We provided both indoor and outdoor services to try and accommodate the needs and wishes of everyone. Regular calls with local health authorities and frequent monitoring of public health guidance has become commonplace for the church. We hope to improve our streaming in 2021 and even upgrade our Internet service and WIFI at the church which should be noticeable.

No doubt, we can all look back and complain about how tough things were on us emotionally, or we can simply look back and say "thank you, God, for allowing us to have been able to do what we did." Unlike several Jackson County churches who experienced outbreaks within their church due to no mask requirements, FBC has so far been able to avoid those outbreaks. We have been blessed beyond measure to have not missed one service thanks to streaming, which served as an example to other churches in the association as far as implementing guidance and still yet having church. FBC has demonstrated that you can still honor God in the midst of a pandemic. I want to emphasize that even during the pandemic, we had a soul saved which shows the Holy Spirit is still working. This person is scheduled to be baptized the first Sunday in January. This is a fantastic way start 2021!

To that end, church has been different over the last nine months for all of us. But the God we serve changes not. Even in the darkest days, He shines bright. Let us look optimistically toward 2021 with hope and belief that there are better days ahead. Let us all keep our eyes on Jesus, the Author and Perfector of our faith. FBC is a strong church and getting through this pandemic together will only make us stronger. Let us not for look for differences in opinions on issues of public health and safety, but rather reach for unity that is found in Christ. Pray for your church leaders as they head into the New Year. Pray for their wisdom and guidance to lead the church as God would want them to do.

Friends, we are all *more than conquerors* because of the Holy Spirit who lives in us. We can really...*do all things through Christ who gives us strength* and wisdom and dare I say the courage to do so. May you have a wonderful, healthy, and Happy New Year. I am looking for great things from First Baptist Church this year, and as I mentioned in a recent sermon, we need to be ready to go full steam ahead, when this pandemic is over. May the Lord richly bless you with good health and happiness in 2021. I love our church family.

Our new year begins on January 1 but in the Old Testament, the Jewish New Year was actually 163 days after the first day of Passover (in the spring) close to the autumnal equinox. So it was in September. This is called Rosh Hashanah.

How did they celebrate? God's people would begin the month before Rosh Hashanah to examine themselves and pray for repentance of their sins. Each morning the shofar (a special horn) was blown to remind people to focus on the coming judgement.

The Israelites' custom was to celebrate for two days with feasting or a "seder". At our New Year's dinner, we may have cabbage or some other special food. But the Jewish custom was to have gourds, leeks, spinach, beets and dates. Each food was a symbol for them from the Talmud, a text of their laws and customs.

We can celebrate our New Year with some of the same customs. We should always look inside ourselves and see what we can change for the good.

Let's all ask God to help us with this new year to become the kind of person He would want us to be.
