



Am I the only one shocked that we are ready to begin the month of March? Can you believe that we are already heading into the end of the first quarter of 2021? When we reflect on that, how can we not think about James 4:14 that reminds us that life is vapor, and we are only here for a little while and then we are gone. Naturally, as we prepare to head into spring we begin to think about things coming to life again. For me, the thought of Holy Week beginning later this month is mind blowing. Easter is one of my favorite times of the year. Resurrection Sunday reminds us of the victory we have in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ overcoming death and the grave.

For our church, I'm proposing we use spring as a reminder that it's high time we awake from the COVID hibernation. It's time we get up and get moving again. For the last year, we have been so focused on COVID, some of us have forgotten to live. Don't get me wrong, we still have to be careful, wear our masks and wash our hands, and distance ourselves a little, but we do not have to allow those few measures to derail our happiness and involvement in the church. Instead, of being depressed over nothing changing, look around, things are gradually changing. There's a lot of changes coming this month in our church. We are progressing. Wait until you see the list of events this month and how the church is fully coming to life again.

Here's a list of a few of the activities to watch out for: 1) Meet Your Deacon Dinner returns March 21 at 6:00, 2) God's Cadets resumes for all children up to grade Grade 5 on Sunday nights beginning on Palm Sunday (News Flash -- I'll be working with them and their parents since we have not resumed Sunday evening services yet and I am super excited about this),

3) Sunday School resumes on Easter Sunday at 9:30 for all ages, 4) CommUnity Kitchen is now serving meals in the Fellowship Hall, 3) Easter Egg Coloring and Contest on Good Friday at 6:00, 4) Passion of the Christ Movie on Wednesday evening of Holy Week in the sanctuary, 5) Maundy Thursday Service will be live in the sanctuary this year at 6:30, 6) Our Easter Worship Service will be in the Sanctuary with over flow seating if needed in the Fellowship Hall, 7) the annual Easter Egg Hunt resumes Easter Sunday immediately after church in the courtyard, and 7) Jackson County Ministerial Association's Holy Week Services will be held at the Riverfront Park and our church will be represented.

Another thing underway is that we are in the process of finalizing a baptism that may occur on Easter Sunday as well. Can I just say, that **God is positioning our church for all of us to be joyful again**? We are approaching the anniversary this month of when COVID hit America. I was just in contact with the health department last week and was informed the mask requirement and vocal singing performance restrictions remain in place. So the church will continue those safety measures as we have. But on a positive note, the Governor is beginning to loosen restrictions and each time he does, we are on it. This is one of the reasons we can have the dinner, and resume the activities we have planned as far as social gatherings. Additionally, more and more people are being vaccinated which makes us hopeful that the mask mandate will eventually just become a recommendation. Nonetheless, we see all of this as a huge positive sign moving forward and for the first time in a long time, Jackson County was at the lowest levels of the color coded DHHR map for COVID. **This again is a good news.** 

My hope is we can all pause and say, **I want to use the month of March to say, I am ready to serve the Lord again in His church.** Follow the safety protocols and let's get to living again. Our services will continue to be streamed for those who prefer to watch from home.

However, if you have children and teenagers, I would strongly suggest you try to get them back into the church as soon as you can. For our littlest kids many have not been in church for a year as of March. Many of them are used to wearing a mask with school and going inside to businesses so it shouldn't be a big deal to them.

As part of this renewed excitement, I've met with Sandy Confer our Sunday School Superintendent and she is preparing now for how our Sunday School classes will work, seating, mask use, and what classrooms will be used for spacing. I spoke with Talia Martinez and she is ready to go with Easter activities like the egg hunt for the little kids. I spoke with Ann Johnson and she's ready to crank up the Jr. and Sr. High again. Jon Moore is working tirelessly having our sanctuary and facility fogged with disinfectant multiple times each week to ensure we're clean and safe. Susan West is revved up with activities for Family Life like egg coloring. The deacons are ready to serve you dinner. *Church family, can I say God is so good to us*. He's been good to the church.

And for me, I'm ready for personal revival. I'm ready to see you. You know, Easter is all about our Lord coming back to life for us and giving us victory. Let us use this month to allow God to bring all of us back to life. Let's get life again back in those old dry bones. We are in a good position right now to keep moving forward. To that end, last year's Easter Sunday was virtual and hard on all of us not being together. This year, it will be good to fill the church. Many things we dearly love are coming back together. **Come join me as we begin to get fired up again for God to move.** 

I am excited to spend time with you at the upcoming *Meet Y our Deacon Dinner* on March 21. (Special seating arrangements are being facilitated for that event. The meal is catered and will be served via a buffet line where the deacons will plate your food as you point out what you want as pass through the line to keep everyone safe. Take out will be available for those who feel they cannot be at the event safely). We'll have more on the dinner later. Keep in mind, you will need to wear your mask in-and-out of the building for the dinner and when you get your food, but you can remove it once seated at your table so you can eat, just like you do at the restaurants. Can someone say, "**Praise the Lord**!" Let's get ready! We can do this, together.

Untie them and bring them to me. <sup>3</sup> If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord needs them,' and he will send them at once." <sup>4</sup> This took place to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet, saying, <sup>5</sup> "Say to the daughter of Zion, Behold, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden."

<sup>6</sup> The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them. <sup>7</sup> They brought the donkey and the colt and put on them their cloaks, and he sat on them. <sup>8</sup> Most of the crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. <sup>9</sup> And the crowds that went before him and that followed him were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!" <sup>10</sup> And when he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred up, saying, "Who is this?" <sup>11</sup> And the crowds said, "This is the prophet Jesus, from Nazareth of Galilee.""
