As this month's Anchor arrives, our church is in the middle of Holy Week, and Resurrection Sunday is fast approaching. All we ask is that you let us know you are planning on attending so we can have enough materials. You can bring more eggs if you want. You'll take them home at the end of the night. There will be one contest to decorate/create an egg as "The Pastor Lookalike. The winner's egg will be on display in the pulpit during our Sunday morning Easter Service.

I will end this month's article with some of my favorite Scripture regarding Resurrection Sunday. We have hope because of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Luke 24:6-7 says "He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: 'The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again.'" First Peter 1:3 says, "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead." This means that you and I have a new life, when we receive Jesus as our Savior. This is further hailed by Second Corinthians 5:17 that reads "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!"

FINANCE COMMITTEE

The Finance Committee has met each month since the beginning of the year and has discussed several important issues as we look at how we are managing the resources the Lord has given us at First Baptist Church. First of all, we Praise Him for the blessings of the year! As we reflected on our concerns at this time last year when COVID was beginning, the uncertainty was a bit scary. But it has been a privilege to watch the Lord work through His people and continue to see needs met. In addition, we had some major issues with the furnaces. But, God has been good as He has worked through His people to meet the needs as we face them. We continue to add to the Building Fund (roof) each month and currently have over \$42,000 in that account.

As we try to manage and spend funds wisely, we depend on prayer and participation. We appreciate the prayers of everyone as we try to reach a major goal at the end of this year to be fully operational in a reality budget. This means that if monies are allocated for a group, they will be available for expenditure as needed. And monies allocated for specifics (such as Memorials and programs) are intact. We also want to continue to pay our current expenses in a timely fashion. Everyone can participate in two main ways by:

Spending funds in your charge wisely

The Finance Committee puts in many hours of discussion and work to do the best job they can. We often have varying viewpoints on expenditures just as many in the church do. We are grateful for an atmosphere to express viewpoints openly. We continue to be prayerful to allow the Lord to work among us and in the end we be of one accord.
