# The May 2021 Anchor



We have this hope, a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul...Heb.6:19a

The month of May is upon us and when we think about the month of May, we cannot help but think of remembrances and legacy. Paul gives us a perfect example of such remembrances in Philippians 1:3 ESV when he said, "I thank my God in all my remembrance of you." Paul of course was talking about the impact that the Philippian church had on him. He was gracious for their love and their support. Paul attributed that love and willingness to provide this support and watch-care to the Lord. How many people in our lives have touched us throughout the years with their love and support?

During the month of May our church will remember those in the Military who died serving our nation, those precious loved ones who have passed over the years that we miss dearly, and our mothers who God gave us who have touched our hearts. As we remember and celebrate, let us be like Paul and praise God for their lives. As many of us will visit the graves of loved ones, we will come across monuments of those who have bravely served our nation and gave their life. I always picture Arlington in my mind, with the fields of honor dotted with tiny white headstones. It is hard to fathom more than 1.3 million people have died in U.S. military conflict dating back to 1812. Most deaths occurring in the Civil War in which 620,000 soldiers died.

Memorial Day, originally called Decoration Day, was established as a day of remembrance for those who have died in military service. The national holiday was established in 1971 marking the last Monday in May as Memorial Day. Interestingly, on the Thursday before Memorial Day, 1,200 soldiers of the 3rd U.S. Infantry will place small American flags at each of the more than 260,000 gravestones at Arlington National Cemetery, and then provide patrol 24 hours a day during the weekend to ensure that each flag remains standing (www.officeholidays.com/holiday s/usa/memorial-day). This remembrance and honor has occurred every year since the 1950s. I love the care that is involved to honor these brave men and women who served our nation and gave their lives for freedom.

As far as local recognition here at First Baptist, we'll have our traditional Memorial Day Service honoring fallen soldiers, those in our congregation who passed away between May 01, 2020-April 30, 2021 with a special candle lighting ceremony during our morning worship. During that service, we will also be honoring Philip Lyons who will be receiving his Eagle Scout Award for mapping veterans' graves at Ravenswood Cemetery immediately following in a ceremony in the Fellowship Hall.

Earlier in May, we will be honoring mothers as part of Mother's Day. Some of us still have our mothers with us and if we do, we should do all that we can to love on them. But for many of us, we no longer have our moms here. Let us all pray for those who struggle this time of year because of special loved ones who have gone on to heaven ahead of us. Most of all, let us encourage each other as we remain in this world to be the best we can be – and let us carry on the legacy of those who came before us. Chances are, someone is thanking God for you now but you just don't realize it. That's because you are leaving a legacy of love worth remembering.

- Please Register Early: If you have not <u>pre-registered two weeks prior to camp, please call to see if space is available.</u> We <u>cannot accept walk-in registrations.</u>
- To register, mail your form and deposit or full payment to:
  - West Virginia Baptist Camp at Cowen, 276 Baptist Camp Road, Cowen, WV 26206
- Pick the camp for your child based on the grade they will be in for the school year beginning in the Fall of 2021.
  - Due to COVID 19 protocols, sessions are running at reduced capacity.
  - When registering for multiple camps please mark which camp is your FIRST choice. Due to the reduced capacity, your registration for additional sessions will be placed on a wait list until 2 weeks before the camp session and you will be notified if a spot becomes available.
- A notarized health form is required at the camp for each camper as well as a COVID waiver. Please fill one out
  to send with your child to registration or mail it in. <u>Any participant without a completed health form and COVID
  waiver will not be permitted to stay at camp.</u>
- Registrations are on a "first come, first served" basis, and no one shall be denied admission to our program






