The February 2023 Anchor We have this hope, a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul...Heb.6:19a



February is here! February has always been special to me for several reasons. I love Valentine's Day. My mom is born on the 4th. Jennifer and I had our first date in February 1994. I remember, when I was in school I used to love the month of February because it was the short month. That meant a few days closer to summer break. As I am getting older and the winter weather makes my bones hurt, I am glad we are a few days closer to warmer weather.

This month, I thought I would share with you some interesting thoughts on the Bible. One of the greatest joys I have in my life is Bible study. I absolutely love it. There's something special about breaking down a story in the Bible to read about the culture and manners that are found in the story as well as what theological message God wants us to know. The older I get, the more I know that there is much more to learn about the Bible. I've made it a passion to try to learn the Bible inside and out. I'll never know it all, but I sure want to try.

One of the things I find most interesting in Bible Study is learning things I did not know. Here are some facts about the Bible that you may not know that I found online at overview-bible.com/bible-facts. One, did you know that the Bible was written in three languages? Those languages were Hebrew, Aramaic, and Greek. The Bible was written on three continents – Asia, Africa, and Europe. The longest book of the Bible is Jeremiah. The shortest book is 3rd John. It is also believed to have about 185 songs in the Bible as well.

While these fun facts alone do not mean much, they make digging into the Bible that much more fun. You can read the entire 3rd John in a minute or so. If you've never read a full book in the Bible, start there. In fact, it will take you longer to read this article than that book.

For the last few months, we have been studying the book of Judges on Wednesday nights. This has been eye-opening to say the least. We watched as the people of God, drifted away from Him into a deep snarl of sin after Joshua died, and sin grew as people did what was right in their own eyes. If you have never looked at the book of Judges you should give it a read sometime. We leave that study thinking about our world today. We are only a few generations away from our children and grandchildren forgetting the Lord. The more they stay away from church, the more they do not miss it. Eventually, church becomes something they used to do. This opens the door for sin to swell in our lives as our heart becomes hardened.

This is one of the reasons Sunday School is so important. Our Sunday School should be double the size it is. Ours is doing what so many others are doing, and that means hanging on. We are fortunate to have about 40 people each week. The number of kids we have are limited. We have some classes with no children. Sunday School is where we learn the stories from the Bible that initiates our foundation of learning about who Jesus is. Where we can ask questions, sing songs, learn to pray, and how to honor Him. Without our young people learning this, they have no idea what God wants or expects from us.

I would encourage all of us, to take a strong look at Sunday School and consider getting our kids and grandkids there. There are many fun facts, great stories, and wonderful wow moments tucked away in our Bibles. I can still remember how those little felt people. I can still remember the big blue storybook Bibles. I can even remember my Sunday School teacher's name. Those stories might be the difference in our young people clinging to the Word as adults or simply forgetting God (and maybe not on purpose) – like they did in Judges. I love Bible Study. Perhaps, it was Sunday School nearly 50 years ago, that planted seeds that I didn't know existed. Maybe, it was those seeds that make me love the Bible, like I do today.


In January, we






Engaging with Missions

On Friday, February 17 starting at 5:00 p.m., a group of ladies will be taking turns sending up a flood of mighty prayers for the needs of our people.


Their goal is to have prayers raised up to our heavenly Father for 24 hours.
