We have this hope, a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul...Heb.6:19a

One of the greatest statements that Jesus spoke from the cross was "*Father, forgive them, they do not know what they are doing*" (Luke 23:34). This time of year, we should be forever grateful for those 12 words of comfort and reassurance that demonstrate Jesus is forgiving and compassionate toward all of us. He was extending mercy to those who mocked him, beat him, and nailed him to the cross. It is hard for any of us to imagine that kind of love for humanity.

During the last several weeks of Lent, First Baptist has been preparing our hearts for worship during Holy Week. We have been looking deep within our spirit for things that we need to purge. Those things that crowd our soul and hide the light of Christ in our life. These issues ranged from selfishness, to our lack of forgiveness of others, the issues of anger and resentment, and how we waste so much of the time that God has given us on things that are not building the kingdom. Having spiritual stints in our hearts opens the valves for love to flow freely.

When we think of the forgiveness statement that Jesus made from the cross, we can find comfort knowing that in all of our shortcomings and failures, the Lord sees us as His children, that He loves and favors. The blessings He continually bestows upon us, remind us that we are loved and we belong to Him.

Amy Swanson wrote a piece called "Why Did Jesus Say Father Forgive Them" and in it she said, "By interceding for His transgressors through this prayer, Jesus fulfilled the Old Testament prophecy foretold by Isaiah hundreds of years prior. This prayer, from upon the cross particularly, would have been a confirmation of His identity to those awaiting their beloved messiah, as described by the prophets of God."

What started on Palm Sunday with a triumphant entry into Jerusalem as Jesus is hailed as King of Israel, would eventually turn to the jeers of crucify Him as they placed the crown of thorns on His head. But even still, Jesus saw beyond the glaring error of their ways. He saw them as lost sheep who needed a shepherd. In all of this, He realized that people were flawed and in need of a Savior. That was the purpose of His coming to dwell among us. He was born to die for you and me. Together, His death, burial, and resurrection paved the way for us to be with Jesus in heaven.

We no longer need to carry our guilt and our shame. We no longer need to wear the shackles of sin. Let us be filled with love, excitement and adoration for all that Jesus did for us. This Easter season, let us see that Resurrection for Jesus, meant Resurrection for us. The empty tomb meant meaningful lives. We were buried with Him to walk in newness of life. Thank You, Jesus, for Your forgiveness. Thank You for this special time of the year. While we do not have to remember how we sinned in this life, but we certainly want to remember and celebrate all that the Lord gave for us. Help us to be better Christians and witnesses for You. We rejoice together in our services this month celebrating our risen Lord. Let us tell others about the forgiveness that Christ extended from the cross and that same forgiveness is available to all now. Those 12 words changed my life. How about you?
