



Psalm 111:2 says, "Great are the works of the Lord; they are pondered by all who delight in them."

It is hard to believe that summer is over halfway over as we enter the month of August. For many of us, we have already had our vacations and are preparing for the fall. Summers help us make some great memories with our families. Some of the memories, we might want to document with photographs and shorts notes of our experiences. We may want to put them in a journal of sorts. Did you know that some people in our church keep a diary and personal journal? Leaving a spiritual diary or spiritual journal as part of your legacy for friends and family after we die could be something really special that will be treasured for generations. Our memories and insights can be treasures to others.

The National Institute of Health (NIH) says that there are benefits in keeping a diary. Their study looked at the impacts in Korea for those who wrote spiritual diaries '5–7 times a week.' Those folks reported spiritual growth and psychological wellbeing more than other groups.

The Gospel Coalition says while the Bible does not specifically mention spiritual journaling, certain books of the Bible (e.g., Psalms, Nehemiah, Jeremiah) record prayers, personal life events, reflections on Scripture and other themes often associated with the practice. The goal is to use a journal to remind ourselves of God's faithfulness which in turn helps increase our faith.

The great evangelist D.L. Moody kept journals and diaries ranging from the 1850s upward. Some of the things that are found in his writings are about how he ministered during the Civil War, worked with prisoners of war in the south, and was a champion for women and disadvantaged children. We can learn from Billy Graham that he modeled his own ministry after Moody's. We have these insights because of their writings and love for God that was shared for future generations.

What message are we leaving about what God has done in our lives? We don't have to look for things to share when we journal, we simply write what is on our hearts. For you and me, when we journal, we can connect with God in a personal way, that is private in the moment. We can share our burdens, our fears, our successes and hopes and dreams for our lives and our families and our church. We might just be journaling in an effort to seek the Lord's direction providing clarity and purpose. We might be writing about our own experiences and how the Lord is at work on those actions. As you and I record our faith experiences and spiritual journey, we can offer prayers for those we love, and those who mean the most in our circle of influence.

If you are like me and your mind can wander from time to time, journaling has a way of keeping our thoughts focused as our we write from the heart. Perhaps, your journal becomes one big letter to God. Journaling can be your "joy book" or maybe even be a book of "healing." Journaling is something that many people are open to doing.

Statistically, according to Psychology Today, there is a one-in-two chance you've kept a journal at some point in your life as an outlet for your thoughts, or maybe documenting an experience to revisit later in life. The report said, it is estimated that 1 in 6 people are actively journaling at some level right now. In 2014, a survey indicated 21 percent of children and young people write in a diary at least once a month.

If we can make those journaling moments spiritual and see them as opportunities to connect with Jesus on a deeper level, we can feel closer to Him.

Perhaps you have been thinking about journaling, and if you have, it's never too late. I think of Ron Starkey in our congregation who has been journaling most of his life. He has book after book of events in his life. Ask him about it sometime. God is good to us. We know it. Can we honor Him with our thoughts and meditate on His Word? Yes we can, and journaling helps.

Here are four steps to help you get started:

- 1. Get a notebook or journal, or just start a Word document on your computer. Find a place in your home or wherever you are that is quiet and free of distractions.
- 2. Pray that God gives you a thought for the day and build on that thought. Perhaps your thought is thankfulness. Tell God what you have to be thankful for now and how He has always been there for you. You can even open the Bible read a verse of Scripture and write about that verse and what it means to you. You don't have to write perfectly or even spell words correctly. Just write from the heart as if you are talking to the Lord the entire time. You're basically writing the Lord a letter of sorts.
- 3. Commit to repeating the process tomorrow, or as often as you can. Make sure your thought is dated, so you can reflect on it later.
- 4. Lastly, before you close the book, pray that your journal draws you closer to the Lord and end with an actual prayer of thanks to God for the time and ability you have to journal in that very moment.

I'm reminded of Jeremiah 15:16 that says "Your words were found, and I ate them, and your words became to me a joy and the delight of my heart, for I am called by your name, O Lord, God of hosts." Are we willing to attempt to journal our blessings and needs? Are we willing to bless God with our thoughts? If so, I encourage you to start soon. Don't put off doing until tomorrow, what we can actually do today. As the Scripture says, "Give careful thought to the paths for your feet and be steadfast in all your ways. Do not turn to the right or the left; keep your foot from evil" (Proverbs 4:20–23, 25–26).

Just as we think about summer coming to a close, chances are you have spent a lot of time with family and friends over these last couple of months. Start your journal there, and reflect on God's goodness to you over the summer months. Perhaps the heat of summer has impressed upon you that we are to be hot or cold for the Lord. Perhaps the heat of summer has impressed upon you that we are to have a fervent love one for another.

If you decide to start journaling, just remember, whatever you write, make it from your heart, and it will be perfect. Journaling is not required for Christian growth, however it can be a tremendous help to you in your growth. Why? How? Because you are reflecting on God and applying His Word to your life. If you share those thoughts someday with others, people will see just how you were blessed. Matthew 5:16 said, *"In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven."* In our writings – may we always let our light shine for Jesus.

A lot of us may think about what we plan to do with our money after we die. But, do we ever think about what we can do for our families that doesn't require money after we die. One of those is leaving the journal to someone who will protect it for future generations. God is good now. He will be good to us in the future.
