



The season of Advent is upon us. We are in the midst of anticipation of the Savior's birth. The prophet Isaiah wrote of a "*Wonderful Counselor*" coming to the world some 800 years before Jesus' birth. He wrote in Isaiah 9:6-7 "*For to us a child is born, to us a Son is given, and the government will be on His shoulders. And He will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the greatness of His government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David's throne and over His kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever. The zeal of the LORD Almighty will accomplish this*" (NIV). As counselor, He hears us, He cares for us, and leads us in the paths in which we should go. He is our friend and confidant. We are so blessed that this Wonderful Counselor is accessible to all who calls upon His name.

This message of hope in that day given by Isaiah, meant that the Messiah would fulfill God's covenant with man about the coming of a Kingdom that would never end. The birth of Jesus is the promise fulfilled to mankind, that as a gift to all, we no longer needed to fear perishing, but could rejoice knowing that we have access to eternal life by faith. Jesus came to seek and save the lost, and was careful not to condemn the world (John 3:16-17). What a beautiful picture of God's love for all. Jesus who knew no sin, would take the world's sin upon Himself on the cross, and die in our place as a sacrifice for our sins. All of that started with His precious birth.

This season at First Baptist, there are numerous activities planned to celebrate this wonderful time of the year. There is a movie night on Friday, December 1 with the movie *Jingle Jangle*, followed by the Progressive Dinner and Ornament Exchange on Saturday December 2 beginning at 5. The children's Christmas program during the Sunday morning worship service will be on December 17. The Jr./Sr. High Youth will have their Christmas production on Wednesday, December 20 at 6:30. The church will have our worship service on Christmas Eve at 10:45 and include a performance by the bell choir, and then that same night have the annual Cantata at 7:00. Before and after the Cantata, you can enjoy the luminaria in memory of loved ones that will be display surrounding the outside of the church. Let us take this time of the year to focus our attention on the real reason for the season. That reason is the birth of our Savior Jesus – that Wonderful Counselor from heaven.
