



Resurrection Sunday or what many Christians refer to as Easter Sunday comes early this year on March 31. The holiday marks a special time in the lives of believers as we celebrate the death, burial, and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. I tend to watch in amazement as all of nature seems to come alive this time of the year as flowers begin to spring up from the ground, and the grass gets greener and greener each week. I find myself waking to the sounds of countless birds chirping.

This time of year many people start thinking about getting back into church. Someone might ask you how the term Easter got to be affiliated with Jesus and the Bible. According to *The British and Foreign Bible Society*, the origin of the word Easter is debatable and some Christians are even hesitant to use the term because the word is not found in the Bible. The *Society* points out that the word "Bible" is not in the Bible either, but Christians still use it all the time. They note that the word Easter is found in one Bible and that's the King James Version in Acts 12:4. How it got into that translation and not others is interesting. The *Society* says it got into the translation during a revision of existing texts, stemming back to the work of William Tyndale. Apparently, Tyndale chose to translate the word "pascha" as "Easter" in the Greek. They report Tyndale made the change in Acts 12:4, as well as in all 29 other places in the Bible where "Passover" was mentioned in the New Testament.

However, the *Society* states that reviewers and revisers who produced the King James Version of the translation changed all the other Tyndale references of "Easter" to "Passover" except in Acts 12.4 (KJV) which reads, "And when he had apprehended him, he put him in prison, and delivered him to four quaternions of soldiers to keep him; intending after Easter to bring him forth to the people." It's unknown exactly why. But, it is interesting that the *Society* asserts that these events depicted in Acts 12:4 were not about Jesus' resurrection like we celebrate today, but rather it was about the Passover. They say this is why, "so many biblical scholars, including the Armstrong Institute of Biblical Archeology," believe this KJV translation and use of the word Easter is misleading, noting that every other translation of this verse, has translated the word "Easter" to "Passover" including the New King James Version. So now you know. I find it interesting and I hope you do to. I find myself often interchanging the terms Resurrection Sunday and Easter Sunday. I think everyone will agree, we use the word referring to the celebration of the resurrection of Christ. To that end, this time of the year is a busy time for our church. We have a ton of activities going on throughout the month. I want to pay particular attention to the events around Holy Week. First, an adult painting party is scheduled for the Friday before Palm Sunday (March 22) at which time we will be painting the Old Rugged Cross that is nestled in flowers along with the Scripture of John 3:16 listed above the cross. You can find that image in this edition of the Anchor. The painting technique that will be taught is done by a local artist at her art studio in Fairplain. All materials are supplied. The cost is only \$25. You'll be given an apron to wear to keep paint off your clothes, and then get to keep the finished painting on a large canvas to take home afterward. You'll be pleased. No experience is necessary. This is a step-by-step acrylic painting class. Please see Kristi King or let Susan West know if you want to go and she can advise Kristi. Only 20 spaces are available.

Then on Palm Sunday, we will have an Easter Egg Hunt for the kids following our worship service, followed by the annual Deacons dinner which will feature Baked Steak as the main course. All are welcome to that meal. Then Monday-Friday of Holy Week, you can take part in the daily Jackson County Ministerial Association's Holy Week Services. This year's services will be hosted at Praise Cathedral here in Ravenswood. I will be speaking at the first service on Jesus flipping tables. Different ministers will speak throughout the week. A free lunch will follow each service at 12:30. You'll be blessed by attending the hour-long event daily. Then on Wednesday, our church will host an abbreviated Passover Meal or Seder Meal teaching session in the fellowship hall. You need a reservation to participate in the program as the food for the teaching is pre-plated and planned for the event. Please see Susan if you want to attend. You'll learn how the Passover meal works and its symbolism. Bring your kids.

Then on Thursday of Holy Week, we will have our annual Maundy Thursday service, a Tenebrae service which is held in the dim lighting under candlelight. This quiet service is emotional as we prepare our hearts and minds for the season remembering the death of our Savior. Then on Easter Sunday, we will have a brief Sunrise Service at 6:30 followed by a breakfast buffet at 7:00 in the fellowship hall. Breakfast will be followed by Sunday School at 9:30, and then our celebratory Easter worship service at 10:45. There are so many activities this month, and we hope you will have your fill with the remembrance of the resurrection of our Savior.

In closing, be sure to start thinking about who you are going to invite to church for Holy Week. This is one of the two times of the year that you can invite people to church and they are not offended. All people know Easter and Christmas are traditionally the most attended services all year for churches. Use this to your advantage in bringing your children, grandchildren, family members, spouse, or friend to church. We want to put our best foot forward with hospitality as we welcome people to church who have not been here in a long time. God is blessing our church in a mighty way. Let's stay obedient to the Holy Spirit and watch what God does over the next few weeks in our service. I'm expecting great things and I hope you are, too. He Is Risen! We have a reason to celebrate all month. Let's start today!
