We have this hope, a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul...Heb.6:19a

Have you noticed that time seems to be flying by? We are already heading into the fifth month of the year and the official start to the summer season is not too far away. This is an extremely busy month for the church and for me. This month we will honor our mothers for Mother's Day, celebrate our high school and college graduates on Graduate Sunday, and then remember those members who have passed and those soldiers who sacrificed so much for our nation on our Memorial Day Sunday service. For this month's article, I want to focus on moms. Psalm 127:3 says, "Behold, children are a heritage from the Lord, the fruit of the womb a reward." Someone once said, "A mother is your first friend, your best friend, your forever friend." I can relate.

I find it interesting that one month that celebrates Mom can contain so much joy and so much sadness. We celebrate those mothers who are still with us today, while at the same time, others will mourn the fact they miss their mom who has gone on to heaven. For some of us, this may be the first Mother's Day without our mom. If that's you, then it will be hard. I know people who still struggle every year with Mother's Day, and try to keep themselves busy, so they do not think about it. It's just too hard. If that's you, then know that God is there to help mend your heart. Psalm 147:3 tells us, "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds."

Moms are not just special, they are unique. They are some of the most resilient individuals I know. Proverbs 31:28 ESV beautifully captures this, "Her children rise up and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praises her." Despite their imperfections, we can honor our mothers for bringing us into this world and doing their best for us. Are they perfect? No. Did they make mistakes? Yes. Could they have done better? Maybe. But in all of that, they are still our moms, and that's what makes them special.

God gave us the precious gift of memories, that allow us to remember the impact of our mothers in our lives whether they are living today or are in heaven. We can remember their good traits, and contemplate the areas where they struggled. At the end of the day, they probably all strived to do the best could for each of us. And as we celebrate those mothers in our congregation for Mother's Day, let us remember, that their love and work in their families is without sacrifice. For many of us, it's the mom who is cooking, doing our laundry, maintaining the home, taking the kids to doctor appointments, and attending school functions and meet the teacher events. These women play the roles of mom, wife, nurse, maid, taxi driver, grocery shopper, bill payer, landscaper, friend, counselor, teacher, caterer, holiday celebration manager, and the list goes on and on. I'm fortunate to still have my mom with me today.

She's aging and she has cancer. She used to be able to go anywhere at any time, and now she is slowing down. Her memory is fading. While I recognize all of these changes in her, the one thing that has remained consistent is her love for me. Abraham Lincoln said, "All that I am, or ever hope to be, I owe to my angel mother." My mom isn't perfect, but she loves me. She encourages me. She is one of my biggest cheerleaders in life, and I think she always has been. You know, that same kind of love my mom has for me, I see in my wife Jennifer who loves our children the very same way. Jennifer will sacrifice everything she has, to make sure our kids have what they need. She will fight for them as a mama bear who defends her cubs. She will call them often. She buys things that they may need, even if they don't ask. I know that all of the moms in our church are doing pretty much the same thing for their kids, too. While not all moms are

good moms, they are still our moms. If that was your case, I hope you cut her some slack and maybe even offer or extend forgiveness in your heart. Maybe your mom was too young, maybe she was too stressed, maybe her marriage was tougher than you remember, or maybe she had health issues or financial issues that no one knew about, but her. I know my mom carried the burden of delivering her first child as a full-term stillborn. I still can't imagine having to disassemble a nursery afterward. But, they had to. My mom still mourns the loss of "Toni" today, every March 7, on what should have been her birthday. It's hard for her today and every Mother's Day. Her situation makes me think of the mothers in our church who still carry the burden of losing their children, too. I have often heard that after a mom loses a child, Mother's Day is never quite the same, because they miss that particular child so much, because they are not there to say Happy Mother's Day. Some say, that when they lose a child, part of their heart is buried with them. We have to remember that despite what seems like super-human powers, moms struggle, too. Let us remember that moms are real people with real feelings.

Let me close this way. Being a mom isn't easy. She's on duty 24/7. In a time where we work ourselves to death about every day to have a nice life, moms never really seem to get a break. Sure they complain once in a while, but they don't quit. They keep going. They keep doing it. They love you. They were bonding with you, while you were in their belly. This month, let us remember our mom. Whether she is living here on earth, or enjoying all heaven affords, let us thank God for her inspiration, and may our lives be a reflection of all she is and all that she was. Let the moms in our church learn and apply those valuable lessons that were handed down over the years whether good or bad. Most of all, may our moms today, be the best mom they can be. I know they will because that is just what they do. I am proud to see our church honor moms every year. They deserve it.

We only have our mom for a little while. If you still have your mom today, let us take the time to wish her not only a Happy Mother's Day, but to spend some time with her on that special day. Maybe it's a phone call or a video call. But make some time for her. One day you will probably wish you had more time to spend with her. And, if her mind is failing or her health starting to deteriorate, just be there to say, I love you. One unknown person said this of their mother, "To the world, you are a mother, but to your family, you are the world." To our moms at First Baptist, Happy Mother's Day.






Two young couples became engaged in March.


