

September is upon us, and when I think of September, I think of the Labor Day holiday. President William Howard Taft signed the act, creating the U.S. Department of Labor in his final hours as president on March 4, 1913. Labor Day is observed annually on the first Monday in September and often is a day off for many workers. I tend to think of Labor Day as a day of rest. The Bible tells us we need rest. I'll have more on that in a moment. First, let's look at the history of Labor Day.

According to the U.S. Department of Labor, the Labor Day holiday commemorates American workers' social and economic achievements. They report the holiday is "rooted in the late nineteenth century when labor activists pushed for a federal holiday to recognize workers' many contributions to America's strength, prosperity, and well-being."

Many workers get the day off to honor that resilience. While many people see the Labor Day Holiday as the official end of summer, resulting in last-minute travel trips and cookouts, we can use it as a time of rest.

The Bible tells underscores the importance of rest. As Christians, we find our rest in Jesus. Matthew 11:28-30 says, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble, and you will find rest for your souls. For my voke is easy, and my burden is light."

The weight of the world can bog our minds with overstimulation and frustration. The chaos of jampacked schedules we often carry can leave us running here and there without much time to recharge our spirits and our bodies. We cannot do much to limit what we do in our lives every day, but are we making time to recharge our souls in Christ? Can we make time for Bible reading, Bible study, or even just being around God's people at church?

Hebrews 4:9-11 says, "There remains, then, a Sabbath-rest for the people of God; for anyone who enters God's rest also rests from their works, just as God did from his. Let us, therefore, make every effort to enter that rest so that no one will perish by following their example of disobedience."

When we become spiritually exhausted, we can fall into dangerous habits. We can become so tired that we no longer pray or attend church services. We will put those activities on the back burner to ensure we have time to do everything else. But, if we can reprioritize our lives differently, where we put God first and then schedule everything else, we would be happier and more rested people. We can find comfort and rest in God's Word. We see the same being with God's people.

So this Labor Day holiday, make sure you pause to rest. Make sure you make time for church and things of God. The other things are essential, too, but not as important as your spiritual, physical, and mental health. Rest. You can do it. Take time for yourself, and when you do, lean on God. Look to Him. Praise Jesus because He is good to you. Always incline an ear to what the Holy Spirit is telling you. In these moments, we can say we know that the Lord was always there. Have a safe Labor Day! All month, let us all remember to take time to rest from our Labors. After all, we are only here on earth for a little while.






## Church History

## Did you know...

Our new church archivers, Ellen Varner and Amy Starkey, have been gathering First Baptist history and pictures to scan and save for future generations. We have some really interesting facts that are in our past.

### Here are a few facts:


- In 1951 the decision was made to start raising funds for building improvements and modernization
- In 1952 construction began on the Educational Unit.
- D.E. Cole was the Chairman of the Building Committee.
- J. F. Moore (father of David Moore) was the Chairman of the Trustees and Construction Oversight.
- In 1954 construction was completed
- Week long dedication services were held March 29 to April 4, 1954.
- Work and improvements totaled \$40,000 and included:
  - Educational Unit building addition upstairs classrooms, assembly hall, kitchen, downstairs offices and library.
  - Installation of forced air furnace, new roof, addition of pillars to front porch, wall to wall carpet in the sanctuary, new baptistery, rebuilding of pews and redecorating the sanctuary.
- In February 1954, the church formally changed its name to First Baptist Church, Ravenswood, WV
- Children's Church was organized in 1955 and the choir was organized including Senior High Youth and Adults.

#### **How Are You Training Your Child?**

Proverbs 22:6 tells us "Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart."
